For years 1 to 6, this will be **Class Dojo**, where teachers and parent/carers can communicate securely about your own child, as well as post general class messages. Teachers will let you know more about this in their own half termly newsletters. Foundation Stage pupils will have **Tapestry** and, again, Miss Kelloway will give out more information to Chestnut parents. **4**. These tools are excellent, but they have limitations! PLEASE don't expect immediate responses if you send messages using FaceBook, as I don't monitor it during school hours. Email or phone the office!

- **Uniform:** everyone has turned up looking incredibly smart! During the year, the main things that happen are: 1. Shoes fall to bits. Please just communicate with us if something goes wrong with the school shoes. We understand it can take some time to replace them. If possible, keep them plain, **black** and without flashing lights, hidden toys or edible pieces (I made that bit up, but it wouldn't surprise me). Shoes simply need to be sensible, safe and practical. We also understand they can be costly. Perhaps, if shoes are outgrown, some sort of shoe-swap could be organised between classes? 2. Hair accessories. Without sounding draconian, please ensure that headbands, scrunchies, alice bands, hair clip and bobbles are discrete and simple in colour! We aren't trying to suck the fun out of hair care, but it simply keeps a consistency across the school and we can celebrate the uniqueness of our children through their living and learning in the school day (and they can express themselves through their hair on a Dress Down Friday!). 3. Pre-loved. The school has some used uniform that is in excellent condition. Families can access and Mrs Linthorne, a parent, kindly oversees this for us. I am sure there will be information regarding this very soon.
- **Lunches:** A new lunch menu is coming home today (Friday) and this menu will be for the week commencing 27th for 3 weeks. **PLEASE** return these by no later than Wednesday 15th September. Just as a reminder: if your child is in Foundation Stage, year 1 or 2, they are entitled to the Universal Infant Free School meal (UIFSM) and, therefore, no payment is required. Children in Y3-6 (Key Stage 2) need to enclose payment with their menu. Lunches are £2.40 a day (unless you receive free school meals) and you can choose your days on the menu; you don't need to order a hot meal for every day! Allergies / dietary requirements? Please let us know ASAP.
- A vacancy has arisen within our premises team for a cleaner. The role is to work alongside other members of the team to help maintain a clean and safe environment for our pupils, staff and visitors. 8 hours per week, Term Time plus some holiday working a total of 43 working weeks per

Safeguarding Mr Gillan

- **Safeguarding** is not just child protection; it is the every-day guarding-the-safety. It's why we walk around school, why we hang up bags rather than leave them on the floor and why we have **Golden Rule no.7**: Do Be Safe!
- Alongside this is our safe contact with you, our parents and carers. Please
 ensure that we have your most up to date information in school, including your
 mobile number, a work number, a home number if applicable and an email
 address. It is also necessary for us to have an alternative emergency contact
 should we not be able to reach you; someone local, ideally! If you move, let us
 know. If there are split families, we will always endeavor to get consistent
 communications to both parents, so please do work with us to achieve this.
- We will be sending home a consent form, next week, which will cover a range
 of subjects and scenarios for you to complete and return. Items such as local
 visits to the woods, photos on our website and food tasting that, hopefully, will
 cut down on the necessity to keep asking families.
- Communication on pick-ups: one of our biggest issues can be when your pick-up plans change suddenly! We fully understand that things crop up, but please do communicate with us as soon as you can. We won't let your child go with someone else if we haven't been given the permission by the main carer / parent to the office team (please not on class dojo, as it might not be read in time). In these instances, we contact the family and speak directly. I cannot think of a single example where an adult has been angry when we have enforced this, but it is worth mentioning.
- COVID: how could we not mention it?! Obviously, this is still an ongoing issue locally and nationally and, therefore, is still at the forefront of our thinking. Advice to schools has changed regarding cases and isolating, so please contact us if you have any questions. For example, Individuals identified as close contacts are now not required to self-isolate if they are below the age of 18 years and 6 months. As a school, we are taking measured steps to the return to things around school that, in the past, were more social and mixed. Therefore, up to the Christmas break, we will not be inviting families back into school for events such as Friday worships and services like Christmas nativity plays. Our first Parent Consultations will also be held over the phone as last year. This had very good feedback and we will continue this, reviewing it for the summer term.
- Allergies: in school, we operate a strict no-egg and no-nuts policy due to pupils
 with severe allergies. Please, for example, don't send egg mayonnaise
 sandwiches or hard-boiled eggs. A polite reminder that, if you have a child with
 asthma, you should ensure we have an up-to-date inhaler available in the
 classroom.

• **Just as a general reminder**, I (Mr Gillan) am the Designated Safeguarding Lead and Miss Kelloway is the Deputy Designated Safeguarding Lead. Both Mrs Lucas and Mrs Moore have also had the relevant safeguarding lead training.

The Week(s) Ahead Mr Gillan

- Throughout the year, the teachers will be monitoring the opportunities for any visits OFF the site as well as inviting experts in. Where these visits are planned, we will give families as much time as possible to plan for payments. Teachers will communicate via their own newsletters and Class Dojo. We will also be very mindful of costs of trips. As we have mentioned before, our location makes it very expensive for coaches, so this will be taken into consideration when we plan trips. We do NOT make a profit from trips! Every penny requested is for the event.
- We will be conducting distanced PARENT TOURS for our 2022 intake. If you know a family who is interested, get them to look at these dates: September: 21st 10am and 23rd 2pm

October: 5th 10am, 7th 2pm, 12th 10am and 14th at 2pm.

• **Next week**, we will announce AFTER SCHOOL SPORTS CLUBS for Yrs 3 – 6 coming very soon. It is a quick turnaround as we feel that the term has started so well and we can, actually fit in some groups safely. We endeavor to organise clubs for Key Stage 1 soon.
