- VACCINATION Reminder: Our date for 'FLU vaccinations date is now Monday 17th January. This vaccine is given as a simple spray up the nose. Please complete the consent form using this link.
 https://saint.somersetft.nhs.uk/flu/2021/west . If you do not register, then your child will not receive the 'flu vaccination in school and will, instead, have to make your own arrangements. Please be assured: if your child is not registered, then they will not receive it.
- Our COVID outlook, although remaining at Amber status across the
 region, has actually improved over the past 2 weeks. We still ask you, for
 the time being, to follow our guidance and requests and wear a mask
 when you come into school at drop off / pick-up. If at all possible, please
 continue to regularly LFD test pupils should you feel it necessary and
 keep communicating with our Office Team as you have been.
- On the roads: Just as a new-year reminder....tonight (Friday) was very smooth, so thank you.

Please:

- 1. Try and stick to our one-way system coming to and going away from school. This way, we can maintain that safe flow away from school.
- 2. Think about where you park! Near the entrance to the car park causes a bottle neck for any cars that do need to come in from the other end of the village or stops cars from going down the hill. This is also the case down past the church and onto the corner.
- 3. Chestnut and Rowan families are asked to leave the premises as quickly as possible, because this leaves space for Years 3, 4 and 5 families. Equally, please do not arrive too early if you are here for Yr 3, 4 or 5.
- 4. Our bell goes at 3:30 for 3, 4 and 5. If you time the flow correctly, then there is space outside school most of the time. Teachers stay with their pupils so you do not need to rush and get here before this time.
- 5. I appreciate that after school clubs help stagger cars on the road. We needed to monitor the COVID situation before I could commit to committing staff to after school sports clubs. However, from Monday 24th January, we have put together a 4-week block of clubs for Key Stage 2 classes. More detail on this next bullet point.
